Pokemon Sun & Moon Team Up Prerelease

Sun & Moon– Team Up is the upcoming expansion to the series. The set will have six TAG TEAM Pokemon-GX, six more Pokemon-GX, four Prism Star cards, and more than 25 Trainer cards. Hoopa-GX, Cobalion-GX, Incineroar-GX and Lycanroc-GX will be in the set. This set will also introduce a new Tag Team game machanic. The mechanic pairs two Pokémon on a single card to deliver extremely powerful attacks. However, if your Tag Team Pokémon-GX card gets knocked out, your opponent takes three prizes, offering a high-risk-high-reward mechanic. The Tag Team cards include Eevee & Snorlax-GX, Latias & Latios-GX, Gengar & Mimikyu-GX, Celebi & Venusaur-GX, Magikarp & Wailord-GX, and Pikachu & Zekrom-GX.

The Team Up set is scheduled to release on February 1. Elite Trainer Boxes will also be made available.

Pokemon Video Game - Get Rare Berries

Starting early January of 2019, Pokémon fans will be able to take part in a Berry exciting event (see what we did there?). Players of Pokémon Ultra Sun, Pokémon Ultra Moon, Pokémon Sun, and Pokémon Moon will have the opportunity to get a Mystery Gift containing a selection of special Berries that have previously been unavailable in the games. The Mystery Gift contains an Enigma Berry, a Micle Berry, a Custap Berry, a Jaboca Berry, and a Rowap Berry.

Each of these rare Berries has useful effects when held by a Pokémon, but you may not want to use any right away. By traveling to Poké Pelago in your game, you can plant the Berries to grow more of them. With proper maintenance, your supply of these handy items will never run dry.

Competitive players will be pleased to learn that these Berries can be used in Pokémon Global Link Rating Battles and Online Competitions (unless the regulations state otherwise). They can also be used for the 2019 Video Game Championship Series from the Moon Series onward.

This Berry distribution runs from January 7, 2019 (8:00 p.m. PST), to September 2, 2019 (4:59 p.m. PST), so don't miss out on adding these valuable items to your game!

To get your Berries via Nintendo Network:

- 1. Select Mystery Gift on the main menu.
- 2. Select Receive Gift.
- 3. Select Get via Internet, then Yes, and then Yes again to connect to the internet.
- 4. Watch as you receive your Berries.
- Speak to the delivery person in any Pokémon Center to add the Berries to your inventory.
- 6. Be sure to save your game!

Deck Lab - Basic Deck Building

Welcome back to Deck Lab. We now will continue the card breakdown of Pokemon Deck Building.

Energy Card Breakdown

Basic Energy

Basic Energy cards are just that, basic. They have no pros or cons but instead are fuel for whatever type deck you decide to run. The typical Basic Energy card count ranges between 8 to 14, with faster decks using Trainer cards or Pokémon card abilities to get the Energy out faster.

There's nothing wrong with running multiple types of Energy, but the more types that are run, the harder it may become to get the Energy you need at the right time. Remember, regardless of type, only one Energy card can be attached per turn unless another card lets you attach more.

Special Energy

Special Energy cards pay for Energy costs just like Basic Energy, but they may provide more than one Energy at a time, provide a perk like more damage, heal damage, and more! They essentially enhance your Pokémon cards in some way.

Unlike Basic Energy, Special Energy cards are limited to the usual four copy limit. This means that if you want to run Double Colorless Energy and Rainbow Energy, you're limited to four of each card. Many cards are designed around removing Special Energy or punishing your opponent for using it. Some Trainer cards outright remove it from your Pokémon, some Pokémon

attacks can discard it, and some Pokémon cards are outright immune to attacks from anything with Special Energy attached. Considering that only one Energy card can be attached per turn, attaching Special Energy is a strategic play that may enhance your deck and help it be competitive, but there's a risk that must be considered.

Basic Tips to Get You Started:

KEEP YOUR CARDS ORGANIZED! I can't emphasize this enough! Not only does it make it easier to put your deck together, but you'll have an easier time finding good card combinations and cards that support your deck's strategy.

Use only one or two types of Pokémon (such as all psychic or fire and fighting). Having too many types of Pokémon makes it difficult to get the type of energy you need. Colorless Pokémon can be used in almost any deck since they can use any type of energy.

The 20/20/20 Formula:

Beginner players may want to start with a 20/20/20 deck.

This deck will contain 20 Pokémon cards (You can use the Pokémon TCG Pyramid Formula), 20 Trainer cards (such as items, supporters, stadiums, and Pokémon tool cards), and 20 Energy cards.

As you improve at the game, you may want to deviate from this formula based on how your deck performs.

The Pyramid Formula:

If you want to include Stage 1 or Stage 2 evolved Pokémon in your deck, try to have at least one more of its pre-evolution.

For example, the number of cards you include may look like this: (If using the Rare Candy Item Card you may can skip the Stage One Pokémon.)



Additional Rules for Building a Standard Format Deck

- 1. Cards must exist in the following sets:
- The Standard format for the 2019 season will consist of the following expansions:
- •Sun & Moon and any expansions released afterward
- •Black Star Promo cards numbered SM01 and up

Cards from the following products are also legal:

- Shining Legends
- •Sun & Moon Trainer Kit-Lycanroc & Alolan Raichu
- •McDonald's Collection 2017

New expansions become legal for tournament play on the third Friday of the month they are released.

- 2. Expanded format adds to this list by including all Black & White Sets, XY Sets, plus the McDonald's Sets.. Please see us for help; it is a bit confusing!
- 3. You may use older cards if they have been reprinted in one of the above sets. Use the newest wording on the card when playing. For example, an old Potion card says it heals 20 damage. The reprint says to heal 30 damage. If you use an old Potion in your deck you still get to heal 30 damage.
- 4. You may not have any foreign language cards in your deck.
- 5. If you sleeve your deck, you must sleeve your deck completely with identical sleeves. Note that only clear or solid color sleeves or official Pokémon sleeves with solid colored edges are legal sleeves for Premier tournaments, with the exception of Prereleases.
- 6. Using a deck full of proxy cards is not preferred (<10 to test out a new idea is fine or for keeping very expensive cards safe at home while you play at league). Nor are any cards marked "not legal for tournament play," like World Championship cards. Counterfeit cards are never allowed at any Pokémon event, leagues, or tournaments. To learn how to detect fakes, visit future Deck Labs for a great tutorial or ask your League Owner. If the price for a single booster pack is less that \$3, it's probably fake. (The only exception would be card packs found at the Dollar Tree store.

Rules for the Pokémon VGC 2019 Season

During this year's Pokémon World Championships, rules for the Pokémon 2019 Video Game Championship format was announced! These rules will replace the current VGC 2018 rules from September 4th.

Unlike previous seasons, in the 2019 season there won't be a single format played throughout the year, but instead we will have a different format for each of the season series:

•Sun Series: 4/9/18 – 7/1/19 •Moon Series: 8/1/19 – 1/4/19 •Ultra Series: 2/4/19 – Worlds 2019

All formats follow the GS Cup set of rules, which allows for all Pokémon from the National Dex to be used, except for Mythical Pokémon. This means a lot of powerful legendary Pokémon will now enter the scene. These Pokémon haven't been allowed since 2016, which will give the newer players a chance to play around these powerhouses and take the most out of them with support Pokémon such as Incineroar, Hitmontop, Smeargle, Crobat and Amoonguss.

For those who played in 2016, the news comes with the introduction of powerful new Pokémon such as the Tapus, Solgaleo, Lunala and the Necrozma forms, as well as the nerf of a lot of the common Pokémon from 2016 such as Dark Void Smeargle, Mega Kangaskhan and Mega Salamence. The "rotating" format, with Z-moves and Mega Stones banned during some parts of the year will also bring a challenge to both new and old players, meaning they must adapt to a new metagame much more often than before.

Ruleset Overview

- •All matches are to be played as Double Battles in Pokémon Ultra Sun & Ultra Moon.
- •All Pokémon must have the black clover icon, meaning they must be caught or hatched in •Sun, Moon, Ultra Sun or Ultra Moon, or obtained from an event distribution in these games.
- •For all series formats, GS Cup rules apply, meaning only two restricted Pokémon can be used per team: Mewtwo, Lugia, Ho-oh, Groudon, Kyogre, Rayquaza, Dialga, Palkia, Giratina, Reshiram, Zekrom, Kyurem, Xerneas, Yveltal, Zygarde, Solgaleo, Lunala, Necrozma
- Mythical Pokémon are banned.
- •The "your timer" system has been changed, with the maximum player time increased from 5 minutes to 7 minutes.

Sun Series (September 4th 2018 to January 7th 2019)

In addition to the GS cup rules, these restrictions are unique to the Sun Series.

- •Z-crystals are banned
- •Mega stones are banned
- •Red Orb and Blue Orb are banned
- •Rayquaza can't learn Dragon Ascent

Moon Series (January 8th 2019 to April 1st 2019)

In addition to the GS cup rules, these restrictions are unique to the Moon Series.

•Z-crystals are allowed (except Ultranecrozium Z)

- •Mega stones are banned
- •Red Orb and Blue Orb are banned
- •Rayquaza can't learn Dragon Ascent

Ultra Series (April 2nd 2019 to June 23 2019)

In addition to the GS cup rules, these restrictions are unique to the Ultra Series.

- •Z-crystals are allowed
- •Mega stones are allowed
- •Red Orb and Blue Orb are allowed
